But these developmental processes are interwoven and are only separated abstractly for theoretical purposes. Libido development, on the other hand, pertains to the transformations of psychosexual development. Freud terms this "object-libido." The libido can also get caught up in the ego, which leads to narcissism. A normal part of psychosexual development (see Module 1) is the overcoming of early childhood narcissism (the belief, for example, that everything revolves around one's own desires).
